## INTRODUCTION:

The New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) was established in the year 1986 at Nungphou Bazar, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing -795148, Thoubal District, Manipur by some dedicated youth volunteers and social activists as a non-governmental, non-sectarian, non-denomination, non-political, non-profit making voluntary agency with the primary objective of bringing about an overall development/welfare and an equitable/equatorial society in the remote and less privileged areas. The present report highlights the organisation's activities and significant achievement made during the period from 1st April, 2025 to 31st March, 2026.

## STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION:

The structure of the organization is democratic. It is well constituted and follows the constitution of the organization. It has General Body Members who are dedicated and committed and well experienced in different fields of rural development, social work and public contact /co-operation. The organization has important office bearers consisting of 3 (three) members-President, Secretary and Treasurer to look after the day-to-day affairs and smooth functioning of the organization.

## MANAGEMENT OF NIRMA:

The responsibility and administration of the New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) is entrusted to an Executive Committee/ Executive Body/Managing Committee consisting of 7 (seven) members. The new members of the Managing Committee/Office Bearers of the Organisation elected by the General Body Meeting for election on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2023 and portfolios of the members of the Managing Committee was elected on 13/09/2023 by the Managing Committee of the Organisation. The elected members of the Managing Committee of NIRMA were approved by the Deputy Registrar of Societies, Thoubal, Manipur on 03/11/2023.

## ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

The Organization has an Advisory Committee consisting of 5 (five) members. The Members of the Advisory Committee were reformed during the period 2020-2021 for a period of 4 years for more development of the Organisation. They overviewed the work of the Executive Committee of the organization and advice the members of the Committee as and when necessary. After completion of the life of an Advisory Committee another new Committee is to be formed by the General Body of the Organization to overview/look after the work and function of the Executive Committee.

## PROJECTS UNDER GRANT-IN-AID OF GOVERNMENT OF INDIA



### **MAINTENANCE OF SENIOR CITIZENS' HOME FOR 50 ELDERLY WOMEN:**

#### **Introduction:**

The New Integrated Rural Management Agency have been running the project "Maintenance of Senior Citizens' Homes for 50 for 50 elderly Women "erstwhile "Old Age Home" since 1st April, 1993 under the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment formerly known as Ministry of Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi. The New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) has implemented the programme "Maintenance of Senior Citizens' Homes for 50 elderly Women "at Nungphou, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur with the revised scheme Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana (AVYAY) (Formerly National Action Plan for Senior Citizens (NAPSrC) under the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi. The Organisation have been running the programme to fulfill the main objective of the scheme i.e., to improve the quality of life Senior Citizens by providing basic amenities like shelter, food, medical, care and entertainment opportunities and by encouraging productive and active ageing through providing support for capacity building of Non-Governmental Organisation. NIRMA supplied adequate and good quantity, variety in food stuff with all necessary services like fooding, breakfast, tea for both morning and evening and other food items like fruits, juice, bread, omelet, butter, meat, fish and biscuits, etc. according climate conditions and conventional food habits of the inmates and as demanded by the inmates. During the period under report, NIRMA has undertaken EAT Module implementation and installation of live feed of CCTV Camera linked with website. The total number of staff in the Senior Citizen's Home were 12 (Twelve)namely (i) Superintendent, (ii) Counselor, (iii) Yoga Therapist (Part time), (iv) Nurse (Part time), (v) Doctor-1(Part time), (vi) Cook-2 (Full time), (vii) Chowkidar-1(Full time), (viii) Helper-2(Full time), (ix) Cleaner-1(Full time) and (x) Accountant to run the Home smoothly, continuously and successfully. During the period under report, NIRMA has performed the programme successfully in close consultation with the Pradhans of Sangaiyumpham Part-I, Sangaiyumpham Part-II and member of Thoubal Zilla Parisha, Sangaiyumpham Kendra.

#### **One Day Free Medical Camp:**

#### **External assistance to the inmates in serious health problem:**

As usual during the period for the year 2025-26, the New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) carried each and every inmate in serious cases to the District Hospital, Thoubal, Regional Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS), Lamphel, Imphal West, Manipur and Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS), Porompat, Imphal East District, Manipur. Sometimes for more serious cases, inmates were brought to the popular hospital of Guwahati, Assam.

#### **Visit of Doctor:**

During the period under report, the Part-Time Doctor of the Senior Citizens Home visited the Home 2 times in a week and 8 times in a month and the nurse of the home visited the home for a minimum of 2 hours per day for 6 days in a week. The nurse of the home supplied required medicines regularly to the inmates as prescribed by the Doctor to achieve free from illness. As the nurse resided near the Senior Citizens Home, the inmates got regular check-up and supply of medicine. A separate residence of the Doctor was also arranged near the Home by the Committee of the Organisation so as to enable him to look after the inmates regularly. Sometimes for serious cases, inmates were carried out to the District Hospital, Thoubal, Regional Institute of

## REGULAR SERVICES RENDERED TO THE INMATES BY THE ORGANIZATION



### Nutrition:

The organization supplied adequate quantity, good quality, variety in food stuff with all the necessary services like fooding, breakfast, tea for both day and night and other fooding items like fruits, juice, bread, omelet, butter, meat, fish, and biscuits etc. according to climate conditions and conventional food habits of the inmates and as demanded by the inmates. The daily indicative menu supplied to the inmates is given below:-

5.	<b>DINNER</b>	Chapati, Rice, Dal, Sabji (Seasonal Vegetable), Khichri Plus Special Meal (Veg/Non-Veg (Meat/Fish) and Sweet (Halwa/ Kheer/ Gulab Jamun, etc.) (twice a week)

### Medical facilities/Medicare:

The Organization provided first aid kit (as advised by the Doctor of the Home), Glucometer, BP Monitoring Machine, Weighing Machine and Medicine as prescribed by the Doctor of the Senior Citizen's Home. As the staff nurse of the Senior Citizens' Home was from the same village of Puleipokpi, Sangaiyumpham Part-1, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, the inmates of the Senior Citizens' Home got regular health check-up, full help and at any time when required.

### Recreation:

During the period under report, the organisation provided different Books- 5 numbers, Magazines-4 Nos., newspapers of local language (4 local papers), journals, historical books, novels, morning and evening walking, minor physical exercise to the capable inmates, etc. and religious congregation-reading of Quran and Tradition-once in a week. Facility for meeting with relatives, cultural meet, films show was also provided. The NIRMA provided Games like caroms, chess, radios, T.V.s with cable connection of TATA SKY, film show-Cultural and Geographical shows(Once in a week) and other items like slates, chalks, pencils, exercise books, primary books for adult literacy, etc. From the above items the inmates able to know the efficient knowledge of past and present situation of Manipur and World.

### **Clothing:**

Keeping in view local climate, weather conditions and traditional norms, the Organization provided 4 pairs of clothing like Sarwar-Kurta, Saree-Blouse, Petticoat, Shirt-Paint, Kurta Pyjama, Dhoti-Kurta, Lungi Kurta/Phanek (traditional cloth of women of Manipur), towel and Woolens every year and Mosquito Net, Blanket, Pillow and other winter and summer clothes including sandal/ chapels to each and every beneficiary/inmate. The Organization have provided other day by day necessary items like soap, hair oil, tooth brush, tooth paste and Dettol soap and other soap from time to time and comb, mirror etc. to the inmates to fulfill their necessity.

### **Hygiene and Sanitation:**

The Organization have 3 staff for the project namely Chowkidar, Helper and Cleaner as per guideline of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Ageing Section, Government of India, New Delhi and they cleaned all the Rooms, Verandah/Courtyard and Kitchen at least 2 times a day and toilets at least 3 times a day.

### **Miscellaneous payments:**

Payments for electricity, water, internet, stationary, postage, maintenance of furniture, generator/inverter, cost of fuel for cooking, replacement of bed sheets were included for Miscellaneous payments.

### **Items for Non-Recurring Grants:**

The main items included in the Non- Recurring Grants were:- Furniture, Chairs, Beds and mattresses(along with Bed Sheets and Pillows), Almirahs, Utensils, Gas Stove, Fan, Desert Cooler, Water Purifier, Grinder /Juicer, Hot Case,/Microwave Oven, Water Tank, Electric Motor & Pump, Washing Machine, Television, Computer, Refrigerator, Inverter, Water Cooler, Geyser, etc.

### **Vegetable Gardening:**

Now a days, Vegetable Growers used various patricides to all commonly used vegetables like Potato, Guard, Cauliflower, Cabbage, Brinjal, Pumkin, Green Peas, Tomato, Ginger, Garlic, Onion, Chilli, Coriander, Spring Onion, Cucumber, Spinach, Ribbed Guard, etc. available in the local markets. The Senior Citizen's Home has a piece of land near the Home. We have planted all the commonly used vegetables in the Senior Citizens Home to the piece of land (Kitchen Garden) just near the Home without any patricides. The capable inmates involved in the gardening of different kinds of vegetable to the kitchen garden.

### **Vocational Training:**

The organisation gave vocational training to the capable inmates for agarbati, fishing net and mat from kauna crafts, etc. The income received from the sale of the finished goods used as their own money. NIRMA purchased the raw materials of the vocational training cum production centre in the Home. Capable inmates involved in the Vocational Training Cum Production Centre of the Senior Citizens' Home and showing the bamboo production for fish capturing, highly demanded by villagers.

NIRMA has been running the NIRMA Computer Academy since the year 1999 at Nungphou Bazar, Jail Road, Imphal West District, Manipur under National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language (NCPUL), Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, Government of India, New Delhi bearing Centre Code No. 220002 and National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), Chandigarh, Ministry of Information Technology and Communication, Govt. of India, New Delhi with the main objective of promoting, developing and propagating Urdu Language and to take action for making available in Urdu language the knowledge of scientific and technological development. The name of the diploma course was "Certificate in Computer Application, Business Accounting and Multilingual DTP (CABA-MDTP)" approved by NSDA (Level), Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India from the academic session January, 2020 having 2(two) Sessions namely January Session and July Session with 2(two) Semester as per instruction of the NCPUL and NIELIT. During the period, 38 (thirty-eight) for January Session, 2025, 48 (forty-eight) students for July Session, 2025 and 15(fifteen) students for the January Session, 2026 have been registered. The Certificate of the course was jointly certified by NCPUL and NIELIT.

Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur under Maulana Azad Education Foundation (MAEF), Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India, New Delhi with the onetime grant of the Ministry. Since its inception, the New Integrated Rural Management Agency has been continuously running the programme from the own source of the organization by giving craft training to poor, minority and other backward classes from the rural villages of

**PROMOTION OF WEAVING TECHNOLOGY:**

The organization commenced the program on 1st April, 2001 at Yangbi Leikai, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur under National Research Development Corporation (NRDC), 20-22 Zamroodpur Community Centre, Kailash Colony, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi with one time grant for purchase of only machine and equipment for the program. Since its inception, the organization has been running the programme from the own source of the organization with the main objective of the project was to give them self-help, self-reliant and self-sustained to the rural poor beneficiary. Some trained and passed out trainee/beneficiary have got job to other shops, production centre and some have confined to their own production Centre. During the period under report, NIRMA benefited 25 beneficiaries (women and girls) selected from the rural villages of Thoubal District of Manipur.

**YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CENTRE:**

The program was started on 1st April, 1988 at Nungphou Bazar, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur under the Nehru Yuva Kendra, Thoubal District, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, New Delhi with one time grant of the Ministry of the Government of India. But, NIRMA has been running the program continuously from its inception from the own source of the organisation by providing local and national papers with magazines and journals etc. to increase the knowledge of the youths. . The main objective of the Centre was to give and increase knowledge of youths of the neighboring villages and public. The Management Committee took the initiative for look after the day-to-day work and function of the Centre. A sum of Rs.12,600/- was incurred in the programme.

**VOCATIONAL TRAINING IN PC & MOBILE /CELL PHONE REPAIRING:**

The New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) commenced the program from the year 2009 at Nungphou Bazar, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur under National Research Development Corporation (NRDC), 20-22/ Zamroodpur Community Centre, Kailash Colony Extension, New Delhi (A Govt. of India undertaking), Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi. As the grant of the programme was one time grant for purchase of machine and equipments, NIRMA has been running the project continuously from the own source of the organization. During the period, 30 beneficiaries belong to poorest of the poor youths were selected to give self-help, self-reliant and self-sustained and solved socio-economic problem of their family were benefitted.

**VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE IN TAILORING, EMBROIDERY & WOOL KNITTING:**

The grant of the project sanctioned by the Central Waqf Council, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India, New Delhi was one time grant for purchase of tools and equipment programme for the trades-Tailoring, Embroidery and Wool-Knitting. Since its inception, 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2015, the New Integrated Rural Management Agency (NIRMA) has been running the program continuously at Yangbi Leikai, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur from the own source of the organization. During the period, 30 numbers of youths mainly women & girls belongs to Minority Muslim Communities from Thoubal District of Manipur and from poorest of the poor family have been selected for the program and they were facilitated.

## ONGOING PROGRAMME/PROJECTS UNDER OWN FUND OF THE ORGANISATION



### **AAN COACHING INSTITUTE:**

This programme was organized by NIRMA as a continuation project which was commenced from the year 2007 at Nungphou Bazar, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur from the own source of the organization with the main objectives- i) to impart knowledge, enhance students learning skills; ii) to help students gain knowledge, understanding and critical thinking abilities; iii) to achieve personal or professional development. During the period, the coaching were 2 types (i) for general education from class V to XII standard and (ii) for entrance examinations. Coaching for entrance examinations included- i) entrance examinations for admission in technical and professional courses; ii) private sector and boarding facility for distance students was also provided in the coaching centre. A selection committee selected 20 students for general classes and 20 students for technical and professional courses and they achieved the benefit of the coaching.

### **URDU STUDY CENTRE:**

The programme was commenced from the year 2013 at Patkha Leikai, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District Manipur from the own source of the Organisation. Since its inception, NIRMA has been running continuously in close consultation with Member of Zilla Parishad, Thoubal Zilla Parishad, Sangaiyumpham Kendra, Pradhan of Sangaiyumpham Part-I and Part-II. The main objectives of the programme were i) to imparting knowledge and skills of writing and reading of Urdu Language from the basic levels; ii) to promote and develop the Urdu Language, enhance teaching quality through professional training and boost employability through technical education. During the period, the program was facilitated by 2 expert Urdu Teachers with 50 students from different villages of Thoubal District and an amount of Rs.91,890/- was incurred.

### **PROMOTION OF BEEKEEPING (APICULTURE):**

A five-day training program (from 11<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2025) on "Beekeeping" was arranged by the organization at the Training Hall of NIRMA. The programme was facilitated by 3 recourse persons from the line Department of Horticulture, Government of Manipur. The main objectives of the program were- i) to equip individuals with the skills to establish, manage and sustainability harvest products from honey bee colonies; ii) to keep bees to collect honey and other products of the hive. More than 30 bee keepers from the Thoubal District were participated the program. An amount of Rs.60,900/- was incurred in the program from the own funds of the organization.

### **CARPENTRY TRAINING CUM PRODUCTION CENTRE:**

The program was commenced on 12th April, 2015 at Cherapur, Sangaiyumpham Part-II, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal, Manipur from the own source of the organization. During the period the venue/location of the project shifted to Khunou, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, Thoubal, Manipur. i) to equip learners with the practical skills, theoretical knowledge and fixture made of wood and other materials; ii) to produce job ready individuals; iii) to give self-help, self-sustain and self-sustain to the rural poor educated youths. A five-day training program from 4 to 8 January, 2026 at the training hall of NIRMA was also organized by NIRMA for giving knowledge of the program to the new beneficiary. During the period, 30 unemployed youths were selected by a selection committee belongs to the poorest of the poor and needy family. An amount of Rs.1,01,500/- was incurred in the program from the own funds of the organization.

## **GENERAL PROGRAMME UNDERTAKEN FROM THE OWN SOURCE OF THE ORGANISATION**

### **WORKSHOP ON PREVENTION OF DRUG ABUSE AND ALCOHOLISM:**

During the period, the programme was organized for 5-days (20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2025) at the Training Hall of NIRMA as the Organisation can't remain dormant in the ever increasing number of immoral drug users and trafficking and as a participant (warrior) of the war on drugs. The workshop was organized with the primary objectives to sensitize and inculcate in the minds of the masses the immoral drug trafficking, abusing drugs and intoxicants and harmful effects leading to grave problems. The workshop was facilitated 2 eminent resource persons from the CMO office, Thoubal, Government of Manipur. Altogether, 30 youths from different villages of Thoubal District, participated the workshop. An amount of Rs.75,500/- was incurred by the organization from its source.

### **TRAINING IN FISH FARMING:**

A five-days (from 10 to 14 September, 2025) program on "Training in Fish Farming" was organized by the organization at Tentha, Thoubal District, Manipur. The main objectives were- i) to equip farmers with scientific techniques for sustainable aquaculture, improve fish production, enhance economic income; ii) to provide training to fish farmers and fishermen for improving their skill in fish farming and fishing. Fishery sector occupies a very important role in the socio-economic development of the State and the country as well. It has been recognized as a powerful income and employment generator. In Manipur out of the 52,000 metric tons of fish required for consumption only 32,000 metric tons are being produced by the fish farmers of the Manipur State annually. So, fish farming was very easy, suitable and income generating program for the unemployed youths of Manipur. Two expert resource persons from the Fishery Department, Government of Manipur facilitated the program with the participation of 30 fish farmers. An amount of Rs. 88,500/- was incurred by the organization from its own source.

### **TRAINING IN POULTRY FARMING:**

A five-day training of the programme was organized from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 at the Training Hall of NIRMA with the participation of 40 rural people (men and women) from neighboring villages of Sangaiyumpham Part-I. The main objectives of the programme were-i) to maximize productivity and profitability by equipping farmers with scientific, technical, and managerial skills in breeding, nutrition, housing, and disease control; ii) to impart skills and mobilize the participants to improve their social and economic conditions; iii) to enhance product quality, and promote sustainable rural livelihood. The programme was facilitated by two experts from the department of Animal Husbandry, Government of Manipur with the participation 50 unemployed youths presented by local clubs/organizations/Associations/Mahila Mandals. An amount of Rs.92, 300/- was incurred in the program from the own source of the organization.

### **DISASTER MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME:**

The programme was organized for five days (18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2026) at Community Hall, Sangaiyumpham Part-I, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur from the own source of the organization. The main objective of the programme were-i) to reduce damages and deaths; reduce personal suffering; speed recovery and protect victims and ii) to minimize loss of life, property, and environmental damage by

preventing new risks and mitigating existing ones through coordinated preparedness, response, and sustainable recovery. The programme was facilitated by 2 eminent experts from the concern department of the Government of Manipur with the participation of 40 representatives from Club/Association/NGO/Mahila Mandals participants participated the program and they expressed about the different types of disaster management such as natural disasters; man-made disasters; complex emergencies; pandemic emergencies; disaster prevention; disaster preparedness; disaster response/relief and disaster recovery.

#### **CENTENARY & ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION:**

The Birth and Death Anniversary of Allama Iqbal were observed on 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2025 and 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2025 as Birth and Death Anniversary at Community Hall Sangaiyumpham, Thoubal District, Manipur. He was born on 9 November 1877 and passed away on 21 April 1938. Iqbal was born and raised in Sialkot, Punjab, British India and studied at Scotch Mission College in Sialkot and Government College in Lahore. He taught Arabic at the Oriental College, Lahore, from 1899 until 1903, during which time he wrote prolifically. Notable among his Urdu poems from this period are "Parinde Ki Faryad" ("A Bird's Prayer"), an early contemplation on animal rights, and "Tarana-e-Hindi" ("Anthem of the Indians"), a patriotic poem—both composed for children. In 1905, he departed from India to pursue further education in Europe, first in England and later in Germany. In England, he earned a second BA at Trinity College, Cambridge, and subsequently qualified as a barrister at Lincoln's Inn. In Germany, he obtained a PhD in philosophy at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München (LMU), with his thesis focusing on "The Development of Metaphysics in Persia" in 1908. Upon his return to Lahore in 1908, Iqbal established a law practice but primarily focused on producing scholarly works on politics, economics, history, philosophy, and religion. He is most renowned for his poetic compositions, including "Asrar-e-Khudi", "Rumuz-e-Bekhudi", and "Bang-e-Dara". His literary works in the Persian language garnered him recognition in Iran. He was known as the "Poet of the East," his poetry inspired self-awareness, unity, and a spirit of awakening among people during challenging times. An amount of Rs.54,452/- was incurred in the program from the own source of the organization.

#### **SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING IN MUSHROOM CULTIVATION:**

NIRMA organized Skill Development Training on Mushroom Plantation for a period of 15 days (5<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>, June, 2025) at Yangbi Leikai, Sangaiyumpham Part-I. P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur. The main objectives of the programme were i) to empower participants with technical expertise for self-employment, promote high-value, low-investment entrepreneurship, and strengthen rural livelihoods; ii) to impart skills and mobilize the participants to improve their socio-economic condition. During the training programme, experts from the concerned Department of Department of Horticulture, Government of Manipur facilitated the programme and 30 rural unemployed youths from the neighboring villages participated the programme. An amount of Rs.38,800/- was incurred in the program from the own source of the organization.

#### **SUBSTENANCE OF INDIGENOUS CULTURE OF MANIPUR:**

The programme was organized for five days (16<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2025) at Hayellabuk, Thoubal District, Manipur. Every community or ethnic group has her own culture and heritage which are taken as the essentials of each of the ethnic groups/communities. The main objective of the programme was to impart an in depth awareness on how to sustain the indigenous culture of Manipur and it focus on preserving a distinct heritage while fostering unity and environmental sustainability. Two experts from the Department of

Culture, Government of Manipur facilitated with the participation of 4 contingents of our ethnic groups. Two experts facilitated the four contingents consisting of 10 members each (10x4=40) in which an amount of Rs. 38,300/- was incurred.



#### **AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON WOMEN AND CHILD LABOURERS:**

The programme was organised by NIRMA at Sangaiyumpham Higher Secondary School for 2 days (16-17 May, 2025) with the objectives of bringing women and child workers from informal sector to the organised sector to make them aware of their rights and duties under various labour laws and uplifting their socio-economic and political status for alleviation of their health hazards, poverty, uncertainty of income unemployment and casual labours. The programme was participated by 40 educated unemployment youths from different villages of Thoubal District. 3 experts from District Labour and Employment Office, Thoubal were engaged for facilitating the programme. The expenditure was Rs. 41,100/- which was from the organisation's own fund.

#### **FARMER'S TRAINING IN ORGANIC FARMING:**

NIRMA organised a five-days of the programme from 10<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2025 at Palli Bazar, P.O. Wangjing, Thoubal District, Manipur. The objectives of organic farming are to produce high quality, nutritious food sustainably while protecting the environment for future generations. It is a well known fact that the food items produced by most farmers by using chemical fertilizers are much more harmful to the general public. The production and demand of chemical fertilizers have been alarming increasing day by day. There is an urgent need to impart an in-depth awareness and skills to the farmers to make bio fertilizers from kitchen wastes and biodegradable wastes to use as organic manures/non-chemical fertilizers. The programme was facilitated by 2 experts from the District Agriculture Office, Thoubal, Government of Manipur with the participation of 40 farmers. The amount of expenditure was Rs. 30,100/- (Rupees thirty thousand and one hundred only) from the own source of the organisation.

#### **WORKSHOP ON MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES:**

The organization conducted the programme for five-day (7<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2025) at Tentha, Thoubal District, Manipur. The primary objective of the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is to drive socio-economic development by fostering entrepreneurship, generating large-scale employment. Knowing that the number of educated unemployed youth has been compounding day by day and they are entrapped on poverty and sufferings and likely to divert from the main stream of social, and hardly able to get square meal and the situations compel them to indulge in anti-social activities. An amount of Rs.32, 500/- was incurred from the own fund of the Organisation.
